Who we are: [Space for Humanity](#) (S4H) was founded to create a globally-minded world. S4H is the first non-profit gateway to space, a philanthropic organization directly enabled by space technology. Our mission is to democratize access to space by providing all expenses paid trips with [Virgin Galactic](#), [Blue Origin](#), and [WorldView](#) -- where anyone, from any walk of life, can apply for an opportunity to experience the [Overview Effect](#): the cognitive shift in awareness that occurs when a human being looks down on the Earth from space. Upon their return, each citizen astronaut will share that experience through a social impact ambassadorship with their communities and beyond. Through this unique program, we believe that we can generate creative solutions to some of the world's most intractable problems.

Project Description: 6-8 months prior to spaceflight, each astronaut will take part in a training program where they are trained physically and psychologically for the intensity of the spaceflight itself, as well as in a leadership training program where they will each develop their own social impact ambassadorship. This project is essential to the Space for Humanity mission. This is not simply about sending people to space – this is about empowering people to impact the world.
